One part of the excitement of National Chemistry Week 2007 (October 21st – 27th) is a poster contest incorporating the theme “The Many Faces of Chemistry”

-  All students from K – 12 are encouraged to participate.
-  Entries must be no larger than 14” × 22” in size, not on white foam board and must be drawn using crayons, paint, colored pencils, or markers.
-  Entries are due to the Milwaukee Section (via your school) no later than **October 30th, 2007.**
-  Don't forget to fill out the registration sheet and attach to the back of the poster or simply write your name, grade, home address, telephone number, your school and address (with telephone number), and your teacher's name and email address.
-  Three winners will be selected in each of the following categories:
 -  K – 2nd grade, 3rd – 4th grade, 5th – 8th grade, 9 – 12th grade
-  First place winners of the Milwaukee Section will be submitted for National-wide judging.
-  Prizes will be awarded at both the local and national level!
